

PATIENT INSTRUCTIONS - COLONOSCOPY:

2 WEEKS BEFORE PROCEDURE

Discontinue all DIET PILLS and APPETITE SUPPRESSANTS (Phentermine or Phendimetrazine) –
please let your scheduler know if you are currently taking these types of medication.
This is for your safety under anesthesia.

7 DAYS BEFORE PROCEDURE

- O Discontinue all Oral Iron Supplements. Discontinue use of Glp-1 agonists (semiglutide, terzepatide, Ozempic, Truliciy, Wegovy, Mounjaro, etc....)
- O Purchase your Prep from the Pharmacy. Disregard the instructions on the Prep Box.

3 DAYS BEFORE PROCEDURE

- o If you are taking Blood Thinners, contact the prescribing provider for instructions.
- Discontinue all Herbal supplements, Vitamins, Anti-inflammatories (Advil, Motrin, Ibuprofen, Aleve).
 It is okay to take Tylenol.
- o Avoid all Beans, Peas, Corn, Popcorn and Grapes.

1 DAY BEFORE PROCEDURE

- Start Clear Liquid Diet in the morning and continue until midnight.
- o NO Solid Food, NO Dairy Products, NO Red / Purple Colored Products.
- o DIET INCLUDES: White cranberry juice, beef or chicken broth, tea, water, coffee, Gatorades, apple juice, white grape juice, orange juice- no pulp, carbonated beverages, popsicles, hard candies and Jell-O.

1ST PORTION OF PREP should be started at 6:00 PM

AFTER MIDNIGHT

NO SMOKING, CHEWING TOBACCO, or ANY TOBACCO PRODUCTS.

NO gum, mints, candy or cough drops. Only Prep and Water until 4 hours prior to arrival time.

DAY OF PROCEDURE

You May take your approved prescribed morning medications with small sips of water. (These include blood pressure meds, anti-seizure meds, & anti-rejection meds). Finish these at least 1 hour prior to starting the prep.

2ND PORTION OF PREP should be started 6 HOURS PRIOR TO ARRIVAL TIME.

Exact arrival times will be given the day before your procedure. Arrival Time is 30 – 45 minutes before your procedure time and is subject to change within a 4 hour window. Your driver MUST arrive with you.

4 HOURS BEFORE ARRIVAL TIME

NOTHING BY MOUTH 4 HOURS PRIOR TO YOUR PROCEDURE.

IMPORTANT TIPS:

- 1. You MUST have someone to drive you home. Your driver should be prepared to remain in the waiting area or in their vehicle during your procedure.
- 2. You may apply Vaseline or Diaper Rash Ointment to the rectal area if you experience discomfort from frequent stools.
- 3. IF YOU GET NAUSEOUS, or have had a weight loss procedure, you may start the Prep Earlier so that you can drink slower and take frequent breaks. You must drink the entire prep as instructed, regardless of your weight or what your stools look like.
- 4. If you have problems tolerating the prep, or you are not getting Results, please call (979) 776-4600 and ask to speak to a triage nurse (or after hour physician).

COMMON CANCELLATION REASONS:

No Driver

- Taking Diet Meds within 2 weeks of procedure
- Drinking fluids within 4 hours of procedure time. - Not following Prep Instructions
- Smoking or using tobacco products the day of procedure.

MEDICAL CONDITIONS:

If you are affected by any of the conditions or medications listed below, please follow these Instructions:

DIABETES	ORAL MEDICATIONS: On the day PRIOR to your procedure take your morning
	doses as usual. Do NOT take your evening dose the day prior to your procedure. Do
	NOT take your diabetic medications on the morning of your procedure.
	INSULIN: On the day PRIOR to your procedure take your morning dose of insulin
	as usual. On the evening prior to your procedure take only half of the regular evening
	dose of insulin. Do NOT take your insulin the morning of your procedure.
	Check your blood sugar frequently while taking the prep solution and the morning of
	your procedure. If you develop symptoms associated with an abnormally low blood
	sugar please contact the doctor at (979) 776-4600.
ASPIRIN	If you are taking aspirin PRESCRIBED by your MD, please continue to take it. If
	you are taking aspirin on your own, please stop taking aspirin 5 days before your
	procedure.
COUMADIN,	Ask the physician who prescribed your medicine how to take it before and after your
PLAVIX, ELEQUIS,	procedure. If you cannot contact your physician, call us several days before your
XARELTO OR	procedure.
